A WORD FROM THE PRACTICE CHAIR

Summer is winding down and I hope you have plans to enjoy the last few weeks of summer before heading off to your local store for back-to-school supplies and clothes shopping. I do hope you have recharged your batteries this summer and are looking forward to sending the children back to school, and getting back to a more normal schedule.

The Heyl Royster team is hard at work on revamping and improving our spring seminar. You may recall that we took a year off for the purpose of providing you with a new product and experience. Even though this seminar will take place in May 2020, we are already working on it and look forward to sharing updates and information about the seminar with you in the upcoming months.

The Illinois Workers' Compensation Commission recently provided its Fiscal Year 2018 Annual Report. It was issued by Chairman Michael J. Brennan and provided to Governor J.B. Pritzker. I wanted to talk with you about the results of the report and what Chairman Brennan is focused upon during his tenure as Chairman.

The focus for Chairman Brennan is a technology upgrade. He wants the IWCC web site to be more user-friendly, and for all reporting and submissions to be done electronically. They are hoping to have the updated system in place as quickly as possible (updates to follow). Eventually, Chairman Brennan would like to see all evidence submitted to the Commission (whether at arbitration or the Commission level) to be done electronically. At this time, when a trial takes place, all exhibits are hand

delivered, on paper, to the arbitrator. This becomes very burdensome and obviously something the Chairman and his Commission want to avoid in the future. We will talk more on that subject in future editions of this newsletter.

Now, on to an overview of the 2018 Annual Report. It has been estimated that approximately 200,000 work-related accidents occur in the State of Illinois annually. In most of these circumstances (or cases) the injured worker does not lose any time from the workplace as a result of the injury. There were approximately 38,400 new claims filed with the Commission in 2018. That is roughly equal to the number filed in 2017. This does not take into account cases which were reinstated or remanded to the arbitrator for further proceedings. Outlined below is information with regard to the number of filings by Zone, as well as information which compares the number of Chicago filings (one hearing site) to the number of downstate filings.

In 2018, approximately 2,100 arbitration Decisions were issued, and approximately 51% of those Decisions were appealed to the Illinois Workers' Compensation Commission. Thereafter, the Commission (appeal) issued 860 Decisions and of those 860 Decisions filed by the Commission, 25% were appealed to the Circuit Courts. We had 208 Circuit Court Decisions issued in 2018, and 80 Appellate Court Decisions. There were no Supreme Court Decisions issued in 2018. Please understand, it is not uncommon for the Illinois Supreme Court to hear no workers' compensation claims. Frankly, it is rare that they hear any workers' compensation claims/appeals.

On the subject matter of cost to employers when dealing with workers' compensation claims and the associated costs, based upon data provided by Oregon Estimate of Premium Rates (https://www.oregon.gov/dcbs/reports/Documents/general/prem-sum/18-2082.pdf) and the latest statistics for 2018, Illinois was at \$1.80 (per \$100.00 of payroll) in comparison to the median rank based upon the 50 states of \$1.70. Our ranking in 2018 was 22 out of a possible 51. Please keep in mind, the No. 1 ranking would note the state which has the most expensive premium rate. Therefore, this statistic tells us that our premium rates for 2018 were more in line with what our premium rates were in 2006. This is the lowest the premium rate has been for quite some time.

In comparing injury rates between our state and the United States (injury per 100,000 workers), we are at 3,028, wherein the U.S. average is approximately 3,200. We are under the median norm at this time. In comparing ourselves to other states in the Midwest, Illinois is toward the bottom in comparison to Wisconsin, Iowa and Indiana. We are more in line with the number of injuries per 100,000 workers when looking at the State of Michigan. Compared to other large industrial states such as Pennsylvania, California, Florida and Texas, we would also consider ourselves in the middle of that pack. For example, the State of California averages 4,200 injuries per 100,000 workers.
